It will be followed by the Award Ceremony and Gala...tons of fun!





A Fresh Perspective | Documentary Short | USA | 11:38 min | Director Aaron Hose | Filmmaker in Attendance

In 2018, a group of African-Americans create the nation's first-ever black beer festival, a historic event aiming to reshape the future of craft beer. Craft beer is an annual multi-billion dollar boom for the United States economy. Yet, the overwhelming majority of this industry remains white-male-dominated, with women and minorities occupying a small fraction of its workforce and brewing culture.

The situation in Colombia has forced over 7 million people to leave their homes. Most of them now live in slums. She asked a TV celebrity that the students admired, if he would consider coming on a canoe trip with 8 boys directly affected by the shooting. Les Stroud, creator and host of the international TV series Survivorman, boarded a plane for the far northern community of La Loche, Saskatchewan, with no agenda but to spend time with the students, in the greatest place of healing on earth; the wilderness. This is a story of how nature heals.

McKenzie Chinn stars as a struggling artist, navigating work and romance in the Windy City. When her boyfriend asks her to drop everything and move cross-country, she soon discovers that her biggest obstacle may be herself. Featuring quirky animation and a revelatory central performance, Olympia is a heartfelt story for anyone who's ever felt adrift on the rough seas of adulthood. It is a coming-of-adulthood story, brought to life through my dynamic, yet personal, cinematic expression. — Plays Sunday PM/Lions Theater

Greg is a love addict whose girlfriend left him for their couples therapist. Depressed, heartbroken, and unemployed, Greg must find a roommate to help pay rent. But Greg scares all potential roommates away, except for a girl named Peyton who moves in and whom Greg falls madly in love with. This film is a grounded comedy about heartache, loss, depression, friendship, family, and love addiction. It's about picking oneself up from rock bottom with the help of those closest to them. It explores looking in the mirror, and learning to forgive those that have hurt you. — Plays Saturday PM/Lions Theater

In many American ski towns, the tourism and services economies would grind to a halt without their Latino populations. In a place like Jackson, Wyoming, the Latino community is a mix of documented immigrants and undocumented workers — many of whom are facing increasing risk of deportation under the current Presidential Administration, often resulting in family separation.

Through individual experiences in tourism-driven mountain communities, this film explores social and economic impacts of the Latino immigrant workforce relating to national immigration policies.

It's like a fantasy football draft, but with elderly presidents and ailing musicians. Riplist follows seven friends from Fargo over the course of a year as they make their selections and live with the consequences. Society often frowns on any unusual or excessive attention to death. Some people have called this hobby "morbid" and "weird" and "just plain wrong." But for these seven competitors, this game of death has taught them the value of life. — Plays Saturday PM/Cine-Round

Saturday at 1:00 pm — "The Push"

The Push | USA | 84 min | Director Grant Korgan

The Push is an inspirational documentary about the power of never giving up. Grant Korgan is a world-class adventurer, nano-mechanics professional, and husband. On March 5, 2010, while filming a snowmobiling seament in the Sierra Nevada back country, the Lake Tahoe native burst-fractured his L1 vertebrae, and suddenly added the world of spinal cord injury recovery to his list of pursuits. On January 17, 2012, along with two seasoned explorers, Grant attempted the insurmountable, and became the first spinal cord injured athlete to literally PUSH himself – nearly 100 miles (the final degree of latitude) to the most inhospitable place on the planet — the bottom of the globe, the geographic South Pole. Grant and his guides reached their destination on the 100th anniversary of the first explorers to travel to the South Pole. Facing brutal elements, demanding topography and presumed physical limitations are just some of the challenges they faced along the journey.

Saturday at 3:00 pm — "Unholy Smokes!"

Forest fires are becoming more common, in part due to climate change, in part due to the careless action of humans and, in part due to the cycles of nature. However, with every passing year, these devastating conflagrations become more impactful, more inescapable. In this program, we'll cover this hot topic from two angles. Forest On Fire explores the causes and consequences of the Eagle Creek Fire in Oregon. WILDLAND is a feature doc following one brave firefighting crew as they endure a season of blazes. In the paraphrased spirt of Andy Warhol, UNHOLY SMOKES! promises you 115 minutes of flame.

Forest On Fire | Documentary Short | USA | 29:50 min | Director Reed Harkness

The Eagle Creek Fire ravaged the Columbia River Gorge, causing communities to evacuate, and stranding 150 day-hikers who dramatically had to hike nearly 20 miles to safety. The fire was set by a 15-year-old boy who threw a lit firework into a dry ravine on the Eagle Creek Trail. This film includes accounts from an eyewitness who saw the boy start the fire, the stranded hikers, and people from the communities that persevered.

Wildland | Documentary Feature | USA | 77 min | Directors Alex Jablonski & Khalil Hudson

Epic and intimate in the same breath, WILDLAND tells the story of a single wildland firefighting crew as they struggle with fear, loyalty, love and defeat all over the course of a single fire season. Icarus Stops for Breakfast is a magical story of love and the relationships that exist between humans and the landscape in which they live, based on the story Eating by Rick Bass.




















